23 - 25, MARCH 2021

The 11th CrimEx regular session is organised from The Hague, Netherlands, via **videoconference on Zoom Pro online platform** due to the ongoing restrictions related to Covid 19.





11THCRIMEX CONCEPT NOTE

CrimEx 11th regular sessions will discuss the best practices on updating the tools for judicial cooperation from relevant partners, including Eurojust and EJN and the outline of the methodology for the design of the new CrimEx documents with the participation of Short Term Experts (STEs).

STEs will outline most important developments in the respective thematic areas, envisaged methodological approach, possible questions to be answered by the CrimEx and other aspects which they consider important.

ACTION 3.1. CONTINUOUS UPDATE OF THE CRIMEX DOCUMENTS AND TOOLS

Expected Result 3.1.1. (ER 3.1.1.): CrimEx documents and tools are updated and disseminated for operational purposes and training activities.

Work package 3.1.1 (WP 3.1.1): Update the CrimEx documents and tools

Following up to the conclusions of the 9th CrimEx session of the EMJ IV on updating the CrimEx Tools and documents, the 11th CrimEx will entrust selected experts to:

- Collect best practices on updating tools for judicial cooperation from relevant partners, including the EJN;
- Develop methodology for the updating of the CrimEx documents;
- CrimEx nominates a contact person in each SPC in charge of coordinating the update the CrimEx documents;
- The updated CrimEx documents are translated into English, French and Arabic;
- The CrimEx documents are disseminated;
- The possibility of interconnecting the EuroMed Fiches and the EJN fiches belges is explored.

Main deliverables WP 3.1.1:

- CrimEx documents and tools are regularly updated and translated into English, French and Arabic;
- The interconnection of the EuroMed Fiches with the Fiches Belges is sought;
- The CrimEx documents and tools are made available in digital version.

ACTION 3.2. PREPARATION OF NEW CRIMEX DOCUMENTS

Expected Result 3.2.1. (ER 3.2.1.): Identification of topics that are relevant to judicial cooperation in criminal matters and analyse the legislations in SPCs to identify gaps and best practices

Work package 3.2.1. (WP 3.2.1.): Drafting new legal and gap analysis

During the inception phase, through extensive consultations with stakeholders and the answers to the thematic questionnaires, four topics were identified as relevant for the drafting of new CrimEx Docs:

- 1. Drafting cross-Mediterranean legal and gap analysis on the transfer of e-evidence in criminal matters
- 2. Protection of personal data in judicial cooperation between SPCs and EUMSs
- 3. Joint investigations, parallel investigations and spontaneous exchange of information between SPCs and EU MSs criminal justice authorities
- 4. Procedural rights of defendants and victims

PMT launched a call for experts enabling the recruitment of experts on the identified subject matters among academics and practitioners from SPCs and/or MSs;



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CrimEx 10th regular session, following the debates during the special session of the launching conference, introduced 2 new topics in the discussion:

- 5. Freezing and confiscation of proceeds of crime agreed upon by the 10th CrimEx
- 6. Model Agreement for judicial cooperation/ mutual legal assistance between SPCs and EU MS to be discussed in the 11th CrimEx

Therefore, the 11th CrimEx will:

- Discuss and define within STEs the scope of the legal and gaps analysis, the envisaged methodology; the expected inputs-outputs, actors involved, and the content of possible questionnaires for the SPCs;
- Selected experts are tasked to draft the legal and gap analysis following the directions stemming from CrimEx, under PMT coordination and in close cooperation with relevant stakeholders depending on the topic;
- Once finalised and validated, the Legal and gap analysis will be translated into English, French and Arabic, disseminated in digital format and incorporated where relevant to the trainings.

Main deliverables WP 3.2.1:

- A list of experts in different topics from SPCs and MSs is established;
- New legal and gaps analyses on relevant topics for judicial cooperation are drafted and validated;
- The legal and gaps analysis are made available in English, French and Arabic, in digital version and incorporated where relevant into the trainings.

OUTLINE OF STEs main TASKS in the elaboration of the new CrimEx Docs and Tools:

- Asses National information (legislation, agencies involved, challenges, gaps, priorities) existing in the area of the new topics, providing an overview of the state of play in the SPCs, and regional context
- Agree on the approach and the research methodology
- Prepare questionnaires (distribute them through CrimEx) and collect the relevant information.

Once STEs have gathered all required information, they will:

- Compare legal aspects and practices with international standards;
- Map out the relevant stakeholders and the relations between them at regional level, with EU
 agencies, in particular Eurojust and EJN and in each of the SPCs.
- Identify SPCs' good practices in the investigation and prosecution of complex judicial cases with a special focus on transnational crime.
- Analyse the support of existing regional networks and the involvement of EU agencies, and identify the EU countries and institutions that can best provide technical support for the capacity building of the SPCs.
- Compare the cross-border cooperation in the researched areas between SPCs, SPCs EUMSs and SPCs – EU Agencies.

The above-mentioned work will require STEs participation to CrimEx sessions, possible missions to the SPCs and meetings with the PMT to review progress made.

STEs will elaborate the proposals for the new CrimEx Docs and Tools.

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11THCRIMEX OBJECTIVES
